1 JANUARY

In 1999, the Euro was introduced, and three years later, in 2002, banknotes and coins were put into circulation.

In 1941, the British fashion designer Vivienne Westwood was born. Westwood is known for bringing the punk music style of the 1970s into the world of fashion.



14 JUNE

The Falklands War ends in 1982. This conflict was a ten-week undeclared war between Argentina and the United Kingdom in 1982, over two British dependent territories in the South Atlantic.

On June 18, 1942, Paul McCartney, a founding member of *The Beatles*, was born. His influential contributions to music have left an enduring imprint on global culture.

1 JULY

The first Tour de France took place in 1903. Initially begun to help increase sales for a French newspaper, 'L'Auto', it is now considered one of the most famous sporting events in the world.

Dolly the sheep is born in 1996. Scientists at Scotland's Roslin Institute became the first to successfully clone a mammal.

The first Wimbledon tennis tournament took place in 1877. There was only one event with just 22 participants. This has since grown to over 250.



14 JULY

NASA flies by Pluto for the first time in 2015. NASA's spacecraft New Horizons becomes the first human-made object to observe the dwarf planet Pluto.

Louise Joy Brown, the first "test-tube baby," is born through in vitro fertilization (IVF) in 1978. IVF is now one of the most popular options to help many conceive.

Martin Luther King Jr. made the famous "I Have a Dream" speech during a march in Washington DC in 1963. His leadership was crucial in passing the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and the Voting Rights Act of 1965.
